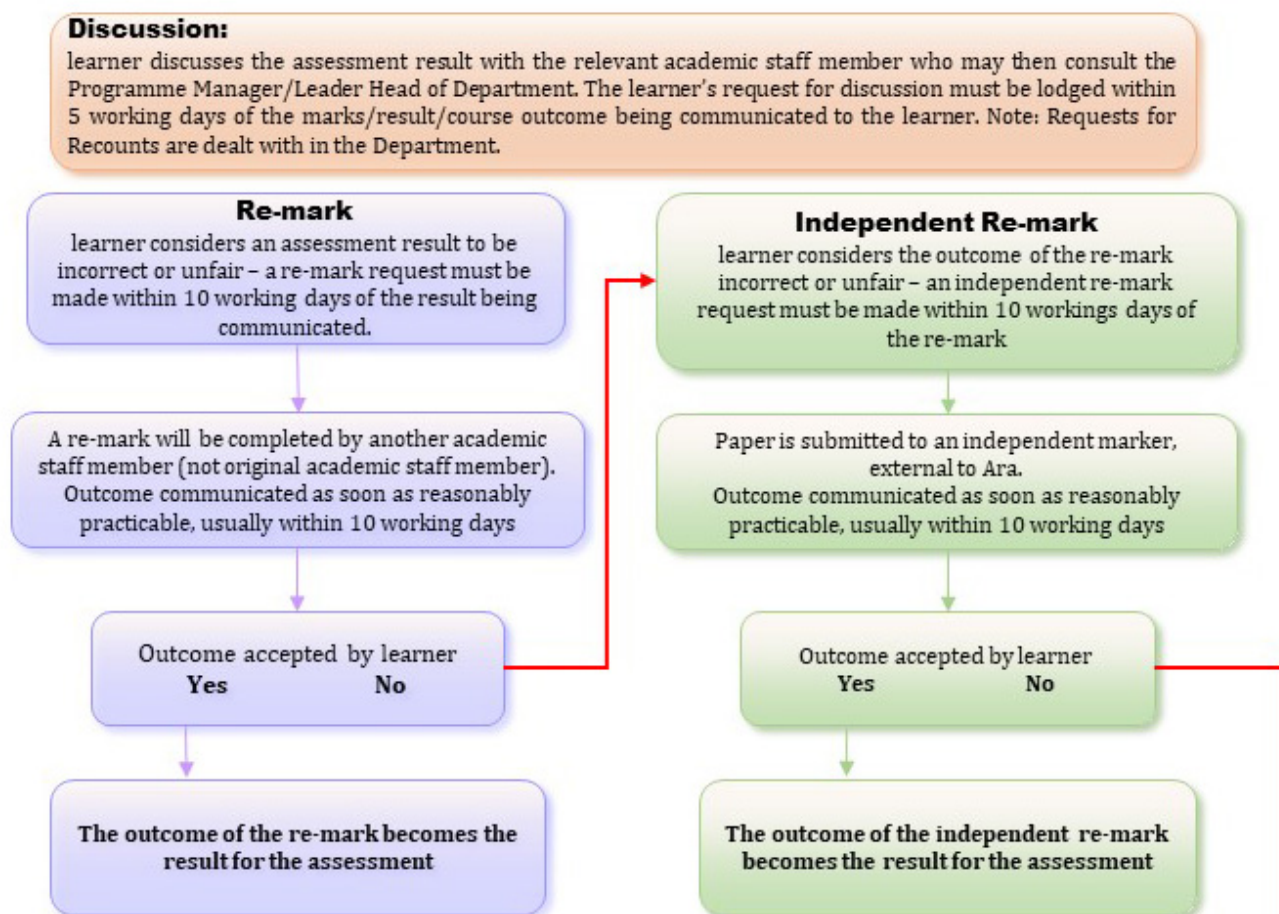


Reconsiderations and Appeals

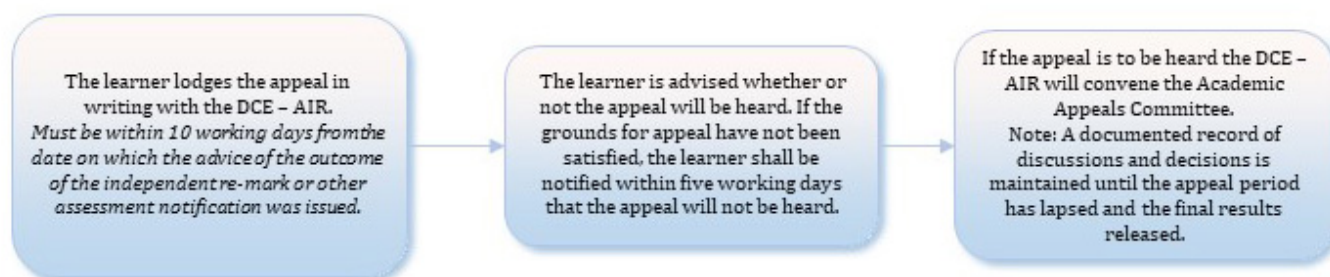
Reconsiderations

If a learner considers the marking of an assessment to be incorrect or unfair, the steps below are to be followed.



Appeals

If the learner/s considers the outcome of the independent re-mark or equivalent review of a result to be incorrect or unfair they may appeal to the DCE - AIR. Grounds for an appeal must be that additional new and significant information has become available or there was an irregularity in the assessment process or in the process used to reach the decisions or an independent re-mark is not appropriate or practicable because the result being appealed involves the assessment of competence in a clinical/work placement.



Reconsiderations and Appeals Involving Clinical / Work Placement

If the learner considers the judgements made by one or more professionals (e.g. clinical lecturers, workplace assessors) in assessing competence in a clinical/workplace to be incorrect or unfair, they may appeal to the Academic Appeals Committee. Grounds for an appeal must be that additional new and significant information has become available or there was an irregularity in the assessment process or processes used to reach a decision.
